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## CSD Family Re-entry FAQs



### Q: How will schools reopen?

A: We will open In Person, with all students in the buildings, Blended, with some students back, or Virtually, with all students learning from home. The decision will be made by consultation between the District and the Health Department, who will meet every two weeks. How safe the community is will be the number one factor. Stay Safe to Stay Open!



### Q: Are students required to wear a mask?

A: Due to the Governor's mandate, everyone will be wearing masks.



### Q: How will students be able to learn from home?

A: All teachers will be able to teach Live from their classrooms, so if students are at home (due to choice or closure) they will still be able to participate in class. They will be able to see each other, the teacher, and the room, ask questions, etc.



### Q: What if students cannot access the internet to participate in Live instruction?

A: We will work with families to get them service or transport children to places where they can connect. All students will have either iPads or Chromebooks.



### Q: Was anything learned from last spring that will be different?

A: We know that students need Live instruction, scheduled classes where attendance is taken, high expectations, and as much guidance as possible. We feel we have provided for these needs with our Live teaching plans.



### Q: Will we receive more detailed information on how the schools will operate this year?

A: Please see the Roadmap for Reentry, found on all District webpages.



**Q: What is the plan for someone who becomes infected or is exposed to someone with COVID-19?**

A: The plan varies by who is infected and with whom they have had contact. The County Health Department will make decisions by contact tracing and their protocols. It might mean that a small group of students and/or staff must go into quarantine or isolation, or it could result in the entire District moving to the Virtual scenario.



**Q: How will families “screen” their children each morning from home?**

A: We have a free app that you can download which asks questions about your child’s temperature and symptoms. If you “pass” all of the questions, just click “submit”, and send your child to school. If not, you must keep them home or find an alternative site for them for the day. We ask that parents find the alternate site now, so you are not tempted to send an ill child to school and potentially spread COVID-19 to others.



**Q: What are the consequences for families/students that aren’t willing to comply with wearing a face mask, or screening their children at home, or sending them to school sick?**

A: We will try to contact them to find out how we can help. Truancy should not be a factor, since students will be counted “present” if they are learning from home (or another site). If noncompliance is chronic, then they will have made the choice to have their children learn virtually from home.



**Q: How will families know what to expect?**

A: We have a detailed communication plan. There is a wide variety of communication going to families, staff, and the community through many means, including public service announcements, signage, smores and emails, videos of procedures, Facebook Live, posts, etc.



**Q: Are there enough disinfecting protocols in place to keep everyone safe?**

A: We have a vast variety of procedures, equipment, and materials to keep the spread of the virus to a minimum. We also had our ventilation system inspected and approved. I also have great faith in our custodial staff.
